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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That §§ 2.2-2001 and 2.2-4310 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:
13	§ 2.2-2001. Administrative responsibilities of the Department.
14	A. The Department shall be responsible for the establishment, operation, administration, and
15	maintenance of offices and programs related to services for veterans of the armed forces of the United
16	States and their Virginia-domiciled surviving spouses, orphans, and dependents. Such services shall
17	include, but not be limited to, benefits claims processing and all medical care centers and cemeteries for
18 19	veterans owned and operated by the Commonwealth. B. The Department shall adopt reasonable regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process
20	Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) to implement a certification program for businesses owned or operated by

22	"Special disabled veteran" means a veteran who served on active duty in the United States military
23	ground, naval, or air service and who was discharged or released from active duty because of a
24	service-connected disability
25	§ 2.2-4310. Discrimination prohibited; participation of small, women-, minority-, and special disabled
26	veteran-owned business.
27	A. In the solicitation or awarding of contracts, no public body shall discriminate against a bidder or
28	offeror because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, status as a special disabled
29	veteran, or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment. Whenever
30	solicitations are made, each public body shall include businesses selected from a list made available by
31	the Department of Minority Business Enterprise and the Department of Veterans Services.
32	B. All public bodies shall establish programs consistent with this chapter to facilitate the participation
33	of small businesses and businesses owned by women and, minorities, and special disabled veterans in
34	procurement transactions. The programs established shall be in writing and shall include cooperation
35	with the Department of Minority Business Enterprise, the Department of Veterans Services, the United
36	States Small Business Administration, and other public or private agencies. State agencies shall submit
37	annual progress reports on minority business procurement to the Department of Minority Business
38 39	Enterprise and on special disabled veteran-owned businesses to the Department of Veterans Services. C. Whenever there exists (i) a rational basis for small business enhancement or (ii) a persuasive
<b>40</b>	analysis that documents a statistically significant disparity between the availability and utilization of
41	women- and minority-owned businesses, the Governor is authorized and encouraged to require state
42	agencies to implement appropriate enhancement or remedial measures consistent with prevailing law. For
43	the purposes of this subsection, "state agency" means any authority, board, department, instrumentality,
44	institution, agency or other unit of state government. "State agency" shall not include any county, city or
45	town.
46	D. In the solicitation or awarding of contracts, no state agency, department or institution shall
47	discriminate against a bidder or offeror because the bidder or offeror employs ex-offenders unless the
<b>48</b>	state agency, department or institution has made a written determination that employing ex-offenders on
49	the specific contract is not in its best interest.

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
