9 10	WHEREAS, adequate housing is an elemental need of every citizen of any age, household size, and income level; and
11	WHEREAS, the availability and affordability of adequate housing affects economic growth,
12	community development and vitality, and the lives of individuals; and
13	WHEREAS, securing affordable housing contributes to (i) positive family stability and childhood
14 15	outcomes, (ii) neighborhood quality and access to opportunity, (iii) household wealth, and (iv) economic
15 16	growth and stability, all of which provide an overall benefit to the quality of living in the locality and the surrounding region; and
17	WHEREAS, the establishment of a comprehensive housing policy at the local level is essential to the
18	creation and preservation of adequate housing; and
19 20	WHEREAS, many localities in the state have moved forward with the development of local housing
20 21	policies to address the particular housing issues of the locality; and WHEREAS, such policies are limited by the existing enabling authority; and
22	WHEREAS, granting additional authority to local government would serve to provide more
23	flexibility in developing innovative housing policies and programs such as expanding inclusionary
24	zoning eligibility and criteria and the creation of employer-assisted housing for government employees
25 26	with funds from general revenue; and WHEREAS, there is a need to examine the feasibility of increasing the statutory options and tools
27 27	that are available to localities to develop more innovative housing policies; now, therefore, be it
28	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Virginia Housing
29 30	Commission be directed to study the feasibility of granting additional authority to local governments to
30 31	develop innovative housing policies and programs. In conducting its study, the Commission shall examine options including, but not limited to, (i) the
32	expansion of inclusionary zoning eligibility to include elimination of high-rise exemptions and allow
33	increased participation by local jurisdictions and (ii) the creation of employer-assisted housing programs
34 35	for government employees with funds from general revenue. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the [(Agency) Virginia Housing
36	Commission] for this study, upon request.
37	The Virginia Housing Commission shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2007, and the
38	Chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its
39 40	findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2008 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether the Virginia Housing Commission intends to
41	submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for
42	publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as
43	provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of
44	legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
