076125732 **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 395** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Rules 4 5 6 on February 2, 2007) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Hanger) Directing the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission to study the impact of issues related to 7 substance abuse on state and local fiscal expenditures. Report. 8 WHEREAS, Virginia has received significant federal funding from the Substance Abuse and Mental 9 Health Services Administration, including nearly \$43 million during fiscal years 2005-2006 to address 10 substance abuse and its prevention; and 11 WHEREAS, despite such financial support, substance abuse continues to produce many social ills at the local level; and 12 13 WHEREAS, this burden includes teenage pregnancies, unmarried parents, premature births, and fetal 14 alcohol syndrome, and drug abuse by a pregnant women triples the likelihood that her baby will have 15 serious medical problems; and WHEREAS, the vast majority of criminal offenses are committed while under the influence and 16 17 many repeat offenders have addictions to alcohol and drugs; and 18 WHEREAS, the adverse impact of substance abuse on families and society in Virginia requires 19 further review of state and local expenditures; now, therefore, be it 20 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and 21 Review Commission be directed to study the impact of issues related to substance abuse on state and 22 local fiscal expenditures. The study should consider social problems aggravated by substance abuse including, but not limited to, teenage pregnancy, out-of-wedlock births, sexually transmitted diseases, 23 24 domestic violence, broken families, homelessness, crime, and poor school performance. 25 In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall examine existing programs, the need for new programs, and funding initiatives that could potentially save significant sums 26 27 of money by focusing on prevention and treatment of substance abuse. Technical assistance shall be provided to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission by the 28 29 Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services. All agencies of the 30 Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission for this 31 study, upon request. 32 The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2007 and for the second year by November 30, 2008, and the chairman shall submit to 33 the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and 34 35 recommendations no later than the first day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for each year. Each executive summary shall state whether the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and 36 37 38 recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summaries and reports 39 shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for 40 the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's 41 website.

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
