4	Requesting the Governor to establish a task force to work with the Department of Conservation and
5	Recreation to study land preservation, water supply protection, and the availability of large parks to
6 7	serve future generations in Northern Virginia. Report.

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11 12	WHEREAS, the population of Northern Virginia, particularly in the Counties of Loudoun, Fairfax, and Prince William, has experienced growth rates as high as 48.8 percent during the past five years, and
12	the population of the Counties of Loudoun, Fairfax, and Prince William is projected to grow, according
14	to the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments, an additional 30 percent by 2020; and
15	WHEREAS, while occupying three percent of the land area in the Commonwealth, the Counties of
16	Loudoun, Fairfax, Arlington, and Prince William and the Cities of Alexandria, Falls Church, and Fairfax
17	contain 27 percent of the population as determined by the most recent population estimates made by the
18 19	Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service at the University of Virginia; and WHEREAS, residents of Northern Virginia must travel long distances to access the vast majority of
20	Virginia State Parks; and
21	WHEREAS, the acreage of parkland in Northern Virginia has not grown commensurate with the
22	population of Northern Virginia and, in comparison with other mid-Atlantic states, Northern Virginia is
23	deficient in the availability of large public parks; and
24 25	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth has not provided funds to meet the parkland and outdoor recreational needs identified by the Virginia Outdoor Plan; and the \$119 million Virginia Parks and
25 26	Natural Areas Bond Act of 2002 did not result in any parkland acquisition in Northern Virginia; and
27	WHEREAS, federal grants to the Commonwealth from the Land and Water Conservation Fund,
28	which have historically helped finance the purchase of many of the larger regional and county parks in
29 20	Northern Virginia, have declined significantly; and
30 31	WHEREAS, the preponderance of funds derived from local bond issues for parks and recreation are most often allocated to park development as opposed to land acquisition; and
31	WHEREAS, the County of Arlington and the Cities of Alexandria, Falls Church, and Fairfax have
33	virtually no remaining undeveloped land on which to locate additional large parks for passive recreation;
34	and
35	WHEREAS, limited opportunities remain for setting aside land for larger parks and protecting
36 37	sensitive environments in the Counties of Fairfax, Loudoun, and Prince William; and WHEREAS, the cost and competition for land continues to escalate and is a deterrent to fee simple
38	parkland acquisition; and
39	WHEREAS, public ownership of watershed lands as passive parkland or as protected private open
40	space is a low-cost approach to assuring high-quality potable drinking water; and
41	WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for the Commonwealth to devise a creative means of financing
42 43	the acquisition of public lands as parkland and to protect potable water resources in the rapidly developing areas of Northern Virginia; now, therefore, be it
43 44	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Governor be requested to
45	establish a task force to work with the Department of Conservation and Recreation to study land
46	preservation, water supply protection, and the availability of large parks to serve future generations in
47	Northern Virginia.
48 49	The task force shall include representation from local government, local or regional park agencies,
50	local water authorities, the Northern Virginia Planning Commission, and the General Assembly. Representation from the General Assembly shall include two members of the House of Delegates, to be
51	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional
52	representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates, and one member of the Senate, to be
53	appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules. Legislative members of the task force shall receive such
54 55	compensation as provided in § 30-19.12. The costs of the study shall be borne by the Office of the
55 56	Governor. In conducting their study, the Department and the task force shall identify the necessary actions to
50 57	obtain and preserve undeveloped land in Northern Virginia for the protection of potable water resources
58	and to provide park and recreational opportunities.

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59 The Governor's task force shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2007, and shall submit to the 60 Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings and 61 recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for 63 the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2008 Regular 64 Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
