0 7	Directing the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission to study staffing standards for sheriffs' departments. Report.
8	WHEREAS, Virginia's sheriffs' offices are responsible for operating jails, securing the courthouses,
9	and serving process; and
10	WHEREAS, inadequate staffing of these functions has serious implications for local governments and
11	the Commonwealth relative to the safety and security of citizens, sheriffs, their staff, and inmates in
12	local correctional facilities and the efficient operation of the judicial system; and
13	WHEREAS, sheriffs and regional jail administrators are often responsible for inmates needing mental
14	health and substance abuse services; and
15 16	WHEREAS, the current process for funding sheriffs' departments is a traditional budgeting and reimbursement process that has undergone little revision in the past 50 years; and
17	WHEREAS, although the Compensation Board uses the staffing standards set forth in the budget in
18	addition to requests from local departments, significant discrepancies exist between state-recognized
19	staffing levels and actual workload in many departments; and
20	WHEREAS, although the 1998 General Assembly provided for an increase in staffing standards for
21	law-enforcement deputies, this improvement benefited only those localities without police departments;
22 23	and WHEREAS staffing standards for shariffs' doputies involved in joil operations, court security, and
23 24	WHEREAS, staffing standards for sheriffs' deputies involved in jail operations, court security, and process services remain unchanged; and
25	WHEREAS, there is a need to develop staffing standards for sheriffs' departments that more
26	accurately reflect actual workloads and requirements and to determine the number and funding of
27	additional positions that such revised standards may indicate are necessary; now, therefore, be it
28	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and
29 30	Review Commission be directed to study staffing standards for sheriffs' departments. In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall consider (i) trends
30 31	in personnel costs for jails based on annual reports of the Compensation Board and other pertinent data,
32	(ii) formulas based on different jail construction criteria that will enable the Compensation Board to
33	address staffing needs for jails, and (iii) staffing standards that accurately reflect actual workloads and
34	requirements, including mental health and substance abuse counseling.
35	Technical assistance shall be provided to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission by the
36 37	Compensation Board and the Virginia Sheriffs' Association. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission for this study, upon request.
38	The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall complete its meetings by November 30,
39	2006, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive
40	summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2007 Regular Session of
41	the General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether the Joint Legislative Audit and
42	Review Commission intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its
43 44	findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated
45	Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General
46	Assembly's website.
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
