3. Committee General Laws

4. Title Wine and beer; delivery thereof, permits.

5. Summary/Purpose: Restores to certain Virginia retailers the privilege of delivering wine and beer to their customers. Such privilege was removed as a result of recent federal litigation challenging the constitutionality of Virginia's Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) law. The bill contains technical amendments, including relocating the existing provisions concerning direct shipment of wine and beer (§ 4.1-112.1) to the administration of licenses portion of ABC law.

6. Fiscal Impact Estimates are: PRELIMINARY. See Item 8.

7. Budget amendment necessary: Yes. Item 380.

8. Fiscal implications: According to the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC), all Virginia wineries would be expected to apply for delivery permits. With permits costing \$120 each and 130 licensed wineries, the projected additional revenue generated by this legislation is estimated at \$15,600 per year.

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: The Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control and Virginia wineries.

10. Technical amendment necessary: No.

11. Other comments: Identical to SB1289.
