**4. Title**            Adds an Alcoholic Beverage Control meal-assembly kitchen license.

**5. Summary/Purpose:** Adds new license for meal-assembly kitchens, defined as any commercial establishment that offers to its customers, for off-premises consumption, ingredients for the preparation of meals and entrees in professional kitchen facilities located at the establishment. Under the terms of the license, a licensee is authorized to permit the consumption of lawfully acquired wine or beer on the premises of the licensee by any bona fide customer of the licensee and to serve wine or beer on the premises of the licensee to any such bona fide customer; however, the licensee shall not give more than two five-ounce glasses of wine or two 12-ounce glasses of beer to any such customer, nor shall it sell or otherwise charge a fee to such customer for the wine or beer served or consumed. The privileges of this license shall be limited to the premises of the meal-assembly kitchen regularly occupied and utilized as such. The bill provides for state and local license taxes.

**8. Fiscal implications:** Currently there are 1,110 meal assembly establishments nationwide, up from only 173 in 2004. These are expected to grow to 3,000 plus by 2010 according to the Easy Meal Prep Association.

Currently in Virginia there are 25 meal-assembly establishments, giving Virginia a 2.29 percent national market share. If Virginia maintains that 2.29 percent market share, and given

that the proposed meal-assembly kitchen license is \$100, anticipated revenues are listed below.
