4. Title Insurance consultants, licensed; must enter into written contracts prior to consulting.

5. Summary/Purpose: Requires those consultants that do not sell, solicit or negotiate insurance to enter into a written contract with clients prior to acting as a consultant. Consultants that sell, solicit or negotiate insurance will be required to enter into a written contract with clients before the clients purchase insurance.

- **9.** Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: State Corporation Commission Bureau of Insurance

- **11. Other comments:** Under § 38.2-1839 of the Code of Virginia, all consultants are required to enter into a written contract with clients prior to taking any action as a consultant. The Independent Insurance Agents of Virginia (IIAV) sought legislation on behalf of their insurance consultant members to clarify § 38.2-1839 so that consultants have a better understanding of when a signed written agreement with the client is required for purposes of compliance with § 38.2-1839. The Bureau of Insurance worked with the IIAV on the language of the bill.

The engrossed version of HB 1957 contains a technical amendment on Line 16 to specify that the client of the insurance consultant referred to on Line 16 is the same client referenced on Line 15.
