- **3. Committee** Education and Health
- **4. Title** Standard diploma in career and technical education.
- 5. Summary/Purpose: Requires the Board of Education to establish requirements for a technical diploma in career and technical education, comprised of 22 total credits as follows: (i) four credits in English, one of which must be in technical writing or reading; (ii) three credits in mathematics; (iii) three credits in laboratory science; (iv) three credits in history and social sciences; (v) one credit in the fine or practical arts; (vi) two credits in health or physical education; and (vii) six credits in career and technical education. Of the 22 total credits, a total of six verified units of credit must be required to earn the technical diploma in career and technical education.
- 6. Fiscal Impact Estimates are: See Item 8.
- 7. Budget amendment necessary: Indeterminate.
- 8. Fiscal implications: It is anticipated that this bill will not have an immediate fiscal impact to the state, other than some negligible administrative costs. However, if the number of students who seek this degree increases significantly in future years, it may eventually create the need for additional teachers and facilities to accommodate the growing demand. This could result in the need for additional state funding; however, at this time, there is no way to reliably estimate the number of students who will seek this degree if created so the potential impact is unknown.
