4. **Title** Statewide Fire Prevention Code; enforcement.

5. **Summary/Purpose:** Prohibits the State Fire Marshal from charging a fee for permits issued for the inspection of schools operated or conducted under the auspices of a religious institution. The bill contains a sunset date of July 1, 2009.

7. **Budget amendment necessary:** No.

8. **Fiscal implications:** The bill would prohibit the State Fire Marshal from charging a fee for permits issued for the inspection of schools operated or conducted under the auspices of a religious institution. This would exempt approximately 81 properties from paying inspection fees. Exempting these 81 facilities would result in a nongeneral fund revenue loss of approximately \$30,000 annually, or funding equivalent to that necessary to support .5 FTE. It is anticipated that the revenue loss from this bill could be absorbed within existing resources.
