4. Title Medicine, Board of; disciplinary procedure

5. Summary/Purpose: Requires the Board of Medicine to make available via any department website information regarding any final orders together with any associated notices which impose disciplinary action against a licensee of the Board. The bill prohibits the Board from posting notices that have not been adjudicated and provides that notices/orders that did not result in disciplinary action may be removed upon written request of the licensee. Limits information regarding claims provided to consumers to medical malpractice judgments and settlements of more than \$10,000 within the most recent 10 year period. The legislation also adds a \$10,000 threshold for assessing the competency of a person on whose behalf three medical malpractice settlements of are paid within the most recent 10 year period.
