**4. Title**            Interstate Compact for Juveniles

**5. Summary/Purpose:** HB 2201 repeals the Interstate Compact Relating to Juveniles located in Article 14 (§ 16.1-323 et seq.) of Chapter 11 of Title 16.1 and replaces it with the current version of the Interstate Compact for Juveniles (ICJ), which has already been enacted in 30 states and provides for enhanced accountability, enforcement, visibility, and communication in relation to tracking and supervising juveniles moving across state borders.

**7. Budget amendment necessary:** No

**8. Fiscal implications:** The cost to join the Interstate Commission will be \$22,000. It is anticipated that cost for the Virginia Council for the Interstate Compact for Juveniles created by the enactment of section 16.1-323.1 will be less than \$1,000 annually. The Department of Juvenile Justice has identified funding within its appropriations to absorb these costs. In addition, staff to support the Council are existing employees of the Department. These fiscal implications are consistent with those identified by the Department of Corrections for the Adult Interstate Compact.
