4. Title Delivery of Criminal Warrants

5. Summary/Purpose:

Upon the request of the attorney for the Commonwealth, a copy of any criminal warrant issued at the request of a citizen shall be delivered to the attorney for the Commonwealth for such county or city.

6. Fiscal Impact Estimates are: Indeterminant (see item 8)

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

8. Fiscal implications: According to the Supreme Court of Virginia, data is not available to determine the potential fiscal impact of this bill. Although the passage of this bill could increase certain costs (copying, postage or messenger service), it is not anticipated that the additional costs would be significant.

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: Magistrates, Courts.

10. Technical amendment necessary: No.

11. Other comments: There is an indication that the process of providing copies of warrants as outlined in this bill (not just at the request of a citizen) is already a standard practice in at least some magistrate offices. This bill is similar to SB997.
