**4. Title** Reporting of the effect of the aging population on state agencies

**5. Summary/Purpose:** The bill requires each agency to report by November 15 of each year to the Virginia Department for the Aging (VDA) its progress in addressing the impact of the aging of the population, according to guidance established by the Secretary of Health and Human Resources. The bill also requires the Department for the Aging to prepare a report summarizing the progress made by state agencies and submit such report to the Governor and the General Assembly by June 30 of the following year.

Currently, all state agencies, through individual reports, must report to the Governor and General Assembly by October 1 of each year.

**7. Budget amendment necessary:** No.

**8. Fiscal implications:** The bill has no fiscal impact. It creates a process by which all state agencies report to one agency (VDA). VDA will be responsible for creating a summary report for the Governor and General Assembly, rather than overwhelm them with separate reports for each agency. The bill does impose a minimal burden on VDA to prepare the report, but the agency will be able to do so within its current resources.
