**5. Summary/Purpose:** This bill increases the civil penalty against an employer who violates child labor laws, and the violation results in a child dying in the course of that employment, from \$1,000 to \$10,000. For violations not involving the death of a child, the maximum civil penalty remains \$1,000.
