3. **Committee** Education and Health

4. **Title** Local school boards; contractors.

5. **Summary/Purpose:** Provides that prior to awarding a contract for the provision of services that require the contractor or his employees to have direct unsupervised contact with students, the school board must require the contractor to provide certification that all employees who will have direct unsupervised contact with students have not been convicted of a felony or any offense involving the sexual molestation or physical or sexual abuse or rape of a child.

7. **Budget amendment necessary:** No.

8. **Fiscal implications:** Currently, any contractor or relevant employee that will have direct contact with students is required to provide certification that (i) he has not been convicted of a felony or any offense involving the sexual molestation or physical or sexual abuse or rape of a child; and (ii) whether he has been convicted of a crime of moral turpitude.

This legislation would modify the requirement for certification by making it applicable only to those employees that will have direct *unsupervised* contact with students. In addition, this bill would no longer require certification that the contractor or his employees have not been convicted of a crime of moral turpitude. These modifications may reduce the number of employees that must provide the necessary certification; however, it is not anticipated that this legislation will have any fiscal impact to the Commonwealth.

9. **Specific agency or political subdivisions affected:** Local school divisions.

10. **Technical amendment necessary:** No.

11. **Other comments:** This bill is similar to SB 1038 and HB 1707.
