## 5. Summary/Purpose:

This bill would provide that an individual filing a withholding tax return on behalf of an organization is not required to furnish his social security number with the return. The bill would also provide that such a person would be required to provide his name, social security number, wages and taxes withheld in any file or report that includes the same information for all employees of the organization.

The effective date of this bill is not specified.

TAX would have no administrative costs to implement this bill. This bill would have no revenue impact.

#### 11. Other comments:

#### Current Law

Virginia law does not require individuals filing withholding tax returns on behalf of an organization to provide their social security number with such returns. TAX has general authority to prescribe the forms for all of the taxes it administers. Currently the forms for withholding tax require the taxpayer identification number of the taxpayer, not the officer or employee who signs on behalf of a corporation or other organization.

SB 862 -1- 01/15/07

The registration form for electronic funds transfer (EFT) currently requires that an individual setting up electronic withdrawals from a bank account furnish his social security number. After receiving a complaint about this requirement in December, TAX reexamined the EFT registration process and determined that the use of the social security number could be avoided. TAX is in the process of modifying the forms and procedures accordingly.

### **Proposal**

This bill would prohibit TAX from requiring that a person filing withholding taxes furnish his social security number when filing such a return with TAX. The person would have to include his social security number if his own wages and withholding are included in the return.
