A BILL to amend and reenact § 10.1-109 of the Code of Virginia, relating to subleasing properties to state employees.

9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

10 1. That § 10.1-109 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

§ 10.1-109. Conveyance or lease of lands and other properties.

A. The Director is authorized, subject to the consent and approval of the Governor and the General 12 13 Assembly, following review as to form and content by the Attorney General and the provisions of this 14 article, to convey, lease or demise to any person for consideration, by proper deed or other appropriate 15 instrument signed and executed by the Director, in the name of the Commonwealth: (i) any lands or other properties held for general recreational or other public purposes by the Department, for the 16 Commonwealth; (ii) any lands over which the Department has supervision and control, or any part of 17 18 such lands; or (iii) any right, interest or privilege with respect to such lands. The Director, subject to the consent and approval of the Governor, may renew any such lease, contract or agreement without the 19 20 consent and approval of the General Assembly. Whenever land is acquired by purchase or otherwise for public recreation and conservation purposes under the administration of the Department, the Director is 21 22 authorized to lease the land or any portion of it to the owner from whom the land is acquired upon 23 terms and conditions in the public interest. No lease granted under this section shall be for an initial 24 term longer than ten years, but any such lease may contain provisions for lease renewals, either 25 contingent or automatic at the discretion of the Director, for a like period upon the same terms and 26 conditions as originally granted. If written notice of termination is received by the Director from the 27 lessee or if use of the lease is in fact abandoned by the lessee at any time prior to the end of the initial 28 term or any renewal, the Director may immediately terminate the lease.

29 B. The Director is authorized to lease state-owned housing under the control of the Department to 30 state employees. Such leases shall be approved as to form and content by the Attorney General and the 31 Department of General Services. The leasing of Department-controlled housing to state employees shall be for the purposes of providing security to property of the Department and shall not cause the property 32 to be considered surplus to the agency's need. If the Director determines that the availability of 33 34 state-owned housing is inadequate to meet the onsite security requirements for Department-owned 35 property, he may lease residential property not owned by the Commonwealth from prospective landlords 36 for the purposes of subleasing to state employees who otherwise qualify for leasing state-owned housing. 37 Such leases and subleases shall be approved as to form and content by the Attorney General and the 38 Department of General Services.
