That § 46.2-1094 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 46.2-1094. Occupants of front seats of motor vehicles required to use safety lap belts and shoulder 11 12 harnesses; penalty. 13 A. Each person at least sixteen years of age and occupying the front seat of a motor vehicle 14 equipped or required by the provisions of this title to be equipped with a safety belt system, consisting 15 of lap belts, shoulder harnesses, combinations thereof or similar devices, shall wear the appropriate 16 safety belt system at all times while the motor vehicle is in motion on any public highway. A child under the age of sixteen years, however, shall be protected as required by the provisions of this chapter. 17 18 B. This section shall not apply to: 19 1. Any person for whom a licensed physician determines that the use of such safety belt system 20 would be impractical by reason of such person's physical condition or other medical reason, provided the 21 person so exempted carries on his person or in the vehicle a signed written statement of the physician 22 identifying the exempted person and stating the grounds for the exemption; or 23 2. Any law-enforcement officer transporting persons in custody or traveling in circumstances which 24 render the wearing of such safety belt system impractical; or 25 3. Any person while driving a motor vehicle and performing the duties of a rural mail carrier for the United States Postal Service; or 26 27 4. Any person driving a motor vehicle and performing the duties of a rural newspaper route carrier, 28 newspaper bundle hauler or newspaper rack carrier; or 29 5. Drivers of taxicabs: or 30 6. Personnel of commercial or municipal vehicles while actually engaged in the collection or delivery 31 of goods or services, including but not limited to solid waste, where such collection or delivery requires 32 the personnel to exit and enter the cab of the vehicle with such frequency and regularity so as to render 33 the use of safety belt systems impractical and the safety benefits derived therefrom insignificant. Such 34 personnel shall resume the use of safety belt systems when actual collection or delivery has ceased or 35 when the vehicle is in transit to or from a point of final disposition or disposal, including but not 36 limited to solid waste facilities, terminals, or other location where the vehicle may be principally 37 garaged; or 38 7. Any person driving a motor vehicle and performing the duties of a utility meter reader; or 39 8. Law-enforcement agency personnel driving motor vehicles to enforce laws governing motor 40 vehicle parking. C. Any person who violates this section shall be subject to a civil penalty of twenty-five dollars to 41 be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Literary Fund. No assignment of demerit points shall 42 be made under Article 19 of Chapter 3 (§ 46.2-489 et seq.) of this title and no court costs shall be 43 44 assessed for violations of this section. 45 D. A violation of this section shall not constitute negligence, be considered in mitigation of damages 46 of whatever nature, be admissible in evidence or be the subject of comment by counsel in any action for 47 the recovery of damages arising out of the operation, ownership, or maintenance of a motor vehicle, nor shall anything in this section change any existing law, rule, or procedure pertaining to any such civil 48 49 action. 50 E. A violation of this section may be charged on the uniform traffic summons form. 51 F. No citation for a violation of this section shall be issued unless the officer issuing such citation 52 has cause to stop or arrest the driver of such motor vehicle for the violation of some other provision of 53 this Code or local ordinance relating to the operation, ownership, or maintenance of a motor vehicle or 54 any criminal statute. 55 G. The governing body of the City of Lynchburg may adopt an ordinance not inconsistent with the

provisions of this section, requiring the use of safety belt systems. The penalty for violating any such 56 ordinance shall not exceed a fine or civil penalty of twenty-five dollars. 57
