2 *An Act to amend and reenact § 49-3 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the administration of oath of*

6 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**7 **1. That § 49-3 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**

8 § 49-3. Who may administer oaths to officers.

9 The oaths to be taken by a person elected a member of either house of the General Assembly shall
10 be administered by the clerk or presiding officer of the houses, respectively, or a notary. Those to be
11 taken by any judge of any court of record elected by the General Assembly shall be administered in a
12 court of record, or by any judge, or by any officer authorized by law to administer an oath. Those to be
13 taken by any person elected or appointed an officer of either house of the General Assembly shall be
14 administered by the person and in the manner prescribed by the rules of such house. The oaths to be
15 taken by a person elected or appointed to any other office or post shall, except in cases in which it may
16 be otherwise directed by law, be administered by the clerk of a court of record, by any judge, by a
17 Commissioner or clerk of the State Corporation Commission or by the Secretary of the Commonwealth.
18 A magistrate or person holding a comparable position in another state may administer the oaths to be
19 taken by a commissioner or other person residing therein.

20 *Whenever a person required to take an oath of office is a member of the United States Armed Forces*
21 *and is on active duty, or is deployed by the United States Department of Defense as a civilian, the oath*
22 *set forth in § 49-1 may be administered by a notary public.*

23 **2. That an emergency exists and this act is in force from its passage.**
