As used in this section, "commercial 17 activities" and "commercial source" shall mean the same as those terms are defined in § 2.2-2620. unless 18 19 the context requires a different meaning: 20 "Commercial activity" means performing services or providing goods that can normally be obtained 21 from private enterprise.
