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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 46.2-330 of the Code of Virginia, relating to expiration and renewal of 3 driver's licenses; sex offenders.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6

7 1. That § 46.2-330 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 46.2-330. Expiration and renewal of licenses; examinations required.

9 A. Every driver's license shall expire on the applicant's birthday in years in which the applicant 10 attains an age equally divisible by five. At no time shall any driver's license be issued for less than three nor more than seven years. Thereafter the driver's license shall be renewed on or before the birthday of 11 12 the licensee and shall be valid for five years, expiring in the next year in which the licensee's age is 13 equally divisible by five.

14 B. Within one year prior to the date shown on the driver's license as the date of expiration, the 15 Department shall mail notice, to the holder thereof, at the address shown on the records of the Department in its driver's license file, that his license will expire on a date specified therein, whether he 16 17 must be reexamined, and when he may be reexamined. Nonreceipt of the notice shall not extend the 18 period of validity of the driver's license beyond its expiration date.

19 Any driver's license may be renewed by application, which shall include the applicant's certification 20 of Virginia residency, after the applicant has taken and successfully completed those parts of the 21 examination provided for in §§ 46.2-311, 46.2-325, and the Virginia Commercial Driver's License Act (§ 46.2-341.1 et seq.), including vision and written tests, other than the parts of the examination 22 23 requiring the applicant to drive a motor vehicle. All drivers applying in person for renewal of a license 24 shall take and successfully complete the examination each renewal year.

25 C. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the Commissioner, in his discretion, may 26 require any applicant for renewal to be fully examined as provided in §§ 46.2-311, 46.2-325, and the 27 Virginia Commercial Driver's License Act (§ 46.2-341.1 et seq.). Furthermore, if the applicant is less than 80 years old, the Commissioner may waive the vision examination for any applicant for renewal of 28 29 a driver's license which is not a commercial driver's license, and the requirement or the taking of the 30 written test as provided in subsection B of this section, § 46.2-325 and the Virginia Commercial Driver's 31 License Act (§ 46.2-341.1 et seq.), for any applicant for renewal who is at least 21 years old. Such 32 written test shall not be waived for an applicant less than 21 years old if such applicant's driver's license 33 record on file with the Department contains a record of one or more convictions for any offense 34 reportable under §§ 46.2-382, 46.2-382.1, and 46.2-383. However, in no case shall there be any waiver 35 of the vision examination for applicants for renewal of a commercial driver's license or of the knowledge test required by the Virginia Commercial Driver's License Act for the hazardous materials 36 37 endorsement on a commercial driver's license. No driver's license or learner's permit issued to any 38 person who is 80 years old or older shall be renewed unless the applicant for renewal appears in person 39 and either (i) passes a vision examination or (ii) presents a report of a vision examination, made within 40 90 days prior thereto by an ophthalmologist or optometrist, indicating that the applicant's vision meets or 41 exceeds the standards contained in § 46.2-311.

D. Every applicant for renewal of a driver's license, whether renewal shall or shall not be dependent 42 43 on any examination of the applicant, shall appear in person before the Department to apply for renewal, unless specifically notified by the Department that renewal may be accomplished in another manner as 44 provided in the notice. 45 46

E. This section shall not modify the provisions of § 46.2-221.2.

47 F. 1. The Department shall electronically transmit application information, *including a photograph*, to 48 the Department of State Police, in a format approved by the State Police, for comparison with 49 information contained in the Virginia Criminal Information Network and National Crime Information 50 Center Convicted Sexual Offender Registry Files, at the time of the renewal of a driver's license. Whenever it appears from the records of the State Police that a person has failed to comply with the 51 duty to register or reregister pursuant to Chapter 9 (§ 9.1-900 et seq.) of Title 9.1, the State Police shall 52 53 promptly investigate and, if there is probable cause to believe a violation has occurred, obtain a warrant 54 or assist in obtaining an indictment charging a violation of § 18.2-472.1 in the jurisdiction in which the 55 person last registered or reregistered or in the jurisdiction where the person made application for 56 licensure. The Department of State Police shall electronically transmit to the Department, in a format

- approved by the Department, for each person required to register pursuant to Chapter 9 of Title 9.1, 57
- 58 registry information consisting of the person's name, all aliases that he has used or under which he may
- have been known, his date of birth and social security number as set out in § 9.1-903. 59
- 60 2. For each person required to register pursuant to Chapter 9 of Title 9.1, the Department may not waive the requirement that each such person shall appear for each renewal or the requirement to obtain 61 a photograph in accordance with subsection C of § 46.2-323. 62
- 2. That the provisions of this act shall become effective on January 1, 2009. 63
- 3. The driver's license of each person required to register pursuant to Chapter 9 of Title 9.1, shall 64 expire on the applicant's birthday at the end of a period not to exceed five years.
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
