19	public schools, public charter schools may be established in Virginia as provided in this article.

30 31	"Public charter school" means a public, nonreligious, or non-home-based alternative school located
31 32	within a public school division. A public charter school may be created as a new public school or
33	through the conversion of all or part of an existing public school; however, no public charter school
34	shall be established through the conversion of a private school or a nonpublic home-based educational
35	program. A charter school for at-risk pupils may be established as a residential school. A public charter
36	school shall also mean a publicly chartered individual department or program in math, science, or other
37	critical shortage area, as established by the Board of Education, that exists within a public school.
