Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 27 of Title 2.2 an article numbered
9 9, consisting of sections numbered 2.2-2732 and 2.2-2733, as follows:

Article 9.

State Interoperability Executive Committee.

12 § 2.2-2732. State Interoperability Executive Committee; membership; responsibilities; terms; **13** compensation.

A. The State Interoperability Executive Committee (Committee) is established as an advisory
committee within the meaning of § 2.2-2100 in the executive branch of state government. The purpose of
the Committee is to make recommendations via the Office of Commonwealth Preparedness'
Commonwealth Interoperability Coordinator to the Commonwealth Preparedness Working Group, Secure
Commonwealth Panel, and the Office of the Governor concerning communications interoperability.

B. The Committee shall consist of 30 members and alternates as follows: the Commonwealth 19 20 Interoperability Coordinator appointed by the Assistant to the Governor for Commonwealth Preparedness and the following 29 members to be appointed by the Governor: one member representing 21 the Virginia Association of Chiefs of Police; one member representing the Virginia Association of 22 23 Governmental Emergency Medical Services Administrators; one member representing the Virginia Fire 24 Chiefs Association; one member representing the Office of Commonwealth Preparedness; one member representing the Virginia Sheriffs' Association; one member representing the Virginia Association of 25 26 Counties; one member representing the Virginia Chapter of the Association of Public-Safety 27 Communications Officials; one member representing the Statewide Agencies Radio System; one member 28 representing the Virginia Information Technologies Agency; one member representing the Virginia 29 Municipal League; one member representing the Secretary of Public Safety; one member representing 30 the Secretary of Technology; one member representing the Virginia Military Advisory Council; one 31 member representing the Virginia Department of State Police; one member representing the Virginia 32 Department of Military Affairs; one member representing the Virginia Department of Emergency Management; one member representing the Virginia Department of Transportation; one member 33 34 representing the Virginia Emergency Managers' Association; one member representing Virginia 35 Professional Fire Fighters; one member representing the Virginia State Firefighter's Association; one 36 member representing the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services; one member representing the 37 Virginia Office of Emergency Medical services; and one member from each of the seven Regional 38 Preparedness Advisory Committees.

39 C. Each member shall serve a four-year term; provided that no member, other than the
40 Commonwealth Interoperability Coordinator, shall serve more than two consecutive terms. All vacancies
41 shall be filled for the balance of the unexpired term in the same manner as original appointments.

42 D. The Committee shall elect a chair and may elect a vice-chair from its membership for two-year
43 terms. The Committee shall meet at least six times per year as is deemed appropriate or on the call of
44 the Committee chair. A majority of the members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.

E. Members of the Committee shall not receive compensation but shall be reimbursed for all
reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in
§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825 and as approved by the Commonwealth Interoperability Coordinator. Funding
for the costs of expenses of the members shall be provided by the Office of Commonwealth
Preparedness.

50 § 2.2-2733. Powers and duties of the Committee; staffing.

51 A. The Committee shall plan, promote, and offer assistance to the Commonwealth Interoperability 52 Coordinator in the:

53 1. Annual review and update of the Statewide Interoperability Strategic Plan (Statewide Plan)
54 required by § 9.1-1200;

55 2. Implementation of initiatives contained in the Statewide Plan;

56 3. Developing formal recommendations to the Commonwealth Preparedness Working Group, the

- Secure Commonwealth Panel, and the Governor on the use of interoperability grants to support local, 57
- 58 regional, and state projects for the statewide development, deployment, and maintenance of voice and data communications technologies; 4. Reviewing all communications-related grant requests from state agencies and localities as required 59
- 60 by § 2.2-305; and 61
- 5. Development of the annual report on the status of the Statewide Plan to the Governor required by 62 November 1 of each year. 63
- B. The Commonwealth Interoperability Coordinator's Office within the Governor's Office of 64
- 65 Commonwealth Preparedness shall provide staff support to the Committee.
