6 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**

7 **1. That § 63.2-1231 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**

8 § 63.2-1231. Home study; meeting required; exception.

9 A. Prior to the consent hearing in the juvenile and domestic relations district court, a home study of
10 the adoptive parent(s) shall be completed by a licensed or duly authorized child-placing agency in
11 accordance with regulations adopted by the Board. The home study shall make inquiry as to (i) whether
12 the prospective adoptive parents are financially able, morally suitable, and in satisfactory physical and
13 mental health to enable them to care for the child; (ii) the physical and mental condition of the child, if
14 known; (iii) the circumstances under which the child came to live, or will be living, in the home of the
15 prospective adoptive family, as applicable; (iv) what fees have been paid by the prospective adoptive
16 family or in their behalf in the placement and adoption of the child; (v) whether the requirements of
17 subdivisions A 1, A 2, A 3, and A 5 of § 63.2-1232 have been met; and (vi) any other matters specified
18 by the circuit court. In the course of the home study, the agency social worker shall meet at least once
19 with the birth parent(s) and at least once with the prospective adoptive parents. Upon agreement of both
20 parties, such meetings may occur simultaneously or separately.

21 B. *Any home study conducted pursuant to this section for the purpose of parental placement or*
22 *agency placement shall be valid for a period of 36 months from the date of completion of the study.*
