WHEREAS, Seaman Porter was assigned to SDV Team Two's Supply Department, where he obtained numerous qualifications, including Second Class Swimmer and Boat Coxswain, as he trained to become a Navy SEAL; and

WHEREAS, a diligent and dedicated sailor with great potential, Seaman Porter's military decorations include the National Defense Medal; and

WHEREAS, known for his jovial disposition and deep commitment to family and friends, Seaman Porter will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his mother, Cassita M. Massiah; his father, Freddie N. Porter, Sr.; his sisters, Alexia, Corlette, and Jacqueline; his half-sisters, Sophia, Zarria, Alicia, and Dondre; and numerous other family members, friends, and fellow sailors; and

WHEREAS, Seaman Porter's death is a reminder of the perils faced daily by the thousands of Americans who serve in our armed forces at home and overseas and whose devotion to duty places them in harm's way; now, therefore, be it
