WHEREAS, willing and eager to go beyond what was required of him, Peter Rose spearheaded special programs and activities at the school such as a very successful Renaissance Festival and the Safety Patrol Program; and

WHEREAS, administrators and fellow teachers were always full of praise for Peter Rose, citing his leadership, camaraderie, and ability to inspire others; and

WHEREAS, teachers and students at Thomas Jefferson were saddened when Peter Rose moved to Mary Ellen Henderson Middle School in 2005 because of a change in grade configurations in the school system, and a rose bush was planted in his honor outside the elementary school; and

WHEREAS, an upbeat person with an extraordinary ability to connect with others, Peter Rose will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his wife, Susan; his daughters, Cynthia and Stephanie; and countless other family members, friends, colleagues, students, and former students; now, therefore, be it
