 need; and

WHEREAS, on January 25, 1958, a 1958 tank truck with a portable pump was put into service; and
WHEREAS, the department has grown from one vehicle housed in a garage to more than seven
emergency vehicles housed in a firehouse with five equipment bays, which was built with funds raised
by the members and the community; and

18 WHEREAS, in 1992 Quinton Volunteer Fire & EMS, New Kent Company Two was further licensed19 to run First Responder/Emergency Medical Service calls; and

20 WHEREAS, in 1998 Quinton Volunteer Fire & EMS, New Kent Company Two acquired two
 21 ambulances and became licensed as an Advanced Life Support transport agency; and

WHEREAS, Quinton Volunteer Fire & EMS, New Kent Company Two continues to respond to fireand EMS calls in New Kent County; and

WHEREAS, the members of Quinton Volunteer Fire & EMS, New Kent Company Two are proud of
their accomplishments, their equipment, their station, and their service to the community; now, therefore,
