RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly commend and congratulate Joey Goodrich on his outstanding Special Olympics track and field career and his inspirational performance in Shanghai, China, in the 2007 Special Olympics World Summer Games; and, be it
