WHEREAS, a talented athlete and a shining ambassador for the United States, the Commonwealth, and his hometown of Midlothian, Peter Zaino is a friend to everyone he meets, a leader both in and out the pool, and an exemplary role model for his fellow athletes; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly commend and congratulate Peter Zaino on his stellar Special Olympics swimming career and his inspirational performance in Shanghai, China, in the 2007 Special Olympics World Summer Games; and, be it
