WHEREAS, with professionalism, determination, and compassion, personnel from these many agencies and organizations provided emergency medical assistance, transportation services, security and logistical support, and at times simply comfort to a community that was reeling from unimaginable events; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby commend the rescue squads, police departments, fire departments, sheriff's offices, and state and federal agencies that responded to the tragedy of April 16, 2007, at Virginia Tech; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare copies of this resolution for presentation to all of the above-named organizations and agencies as an expression of the General Assembly's enormous gratitude for their actions in the midst of a crisis.
