10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

11 1. That §§ 17.1-279, 17.1-293 and 17.1-502 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 12 follows:

§ 17.1-279. Additional fee to be assessed by circuit court clerks for information technology.

A. In addition to the fees otherwise authorized by this chapter, the clerk of each circuit court shall assess a \$5 fee, known as the "Technology Trust Fund Fee," in each civil action, upon each instrument to be recorded in the deed books, and upon each judgment to be docketed in the judgment lien docket book. Such fee shall be deposited by the State Treasurer into a trust fund. The State Treasurer shall maintain a record of such deposits.

19 B. Four dollars of every \$5 fee shall be allocated by the Compensation Board from the trust fund for 20 the purposes of: (i) developing and updating individual land records automation plans for individual 21 circuit court clerks' offices; (ii) implementing automation plans to modernize land records in individual circuit court clerks' offices and provide secure remote access to land records throughout the Commonwealth pursuant to § 17.1-294; (iii) obtaining and updating office automation and information 22 23 technology equipment including software and conversion services; (iv) preserving, maintaining and 24 25 enhancing court records, including, but not limited to, the costs of repairs, maintenance, land records, 26 consulting services, service contracts, redaction of social security numbers from land records, and system 27 replacements or upgrades; and (v) improving public access to court records. The Compensation Board in 28 consultation with circuit court clerks and other users of court records shall develop and update policies 29 governing the allocation of funds for these purposes. However, such funds shall not be used for 30 personnel costs within the circuit court clerks' offices. The Compensation Board policies governing the 31 allocation of funds shall require that a clerk submit to the Compensation Board a written certification that the clerk's proposed technology improvements of his land records will provide secure remote access 32 33 to those land records on or before July 1, 2008.

The annual budget submitted by each circuit court clerk pursuant to § 15.2-1636.7 may include a request for technology improvements in the upcoming fiscal year to be allocated by the Compensation Board from the trust fund. Such request shall not exceed the deposits into the trust fund credited to that locality. The Compensation Board shall allocate the funds requested by the clerks in an amount not to exceed the deposits into the trust fund credited to their respective localities.

39 C. The remaining \$1 of each such fee may be allocated by the Compensation Board from the trust 40 fund (i) for the purposes of funding studies to develop and update individual land-records automation plans for individual circuit court clerks' offices, at the request of and in consultation with the individual 41 42 circuit court clerk's offices, and (ii) for the purposes enumerated in subsection B to implement the plan to modernize land records in individual circuit court clerks' offices and provide secure remote access to 43 land records throughout the Commonwealth. The allocations pursuant to this subsection may give 44 priority to those individual clerks' offices whose deposits into the trust fund would not be sufficient to 45 46 implement its modernization plan. The Compensation Board policies governing the allocation of funds 47 shall require that a clerk submit to the Compensation Board a written certification that the clerk's proposed technology improvements of his land records will provide secure remote access to those land 48 49 records on or before July 1, 2008.

D. 1. Secure remote access to land records shall be by paid subscription service through individual 50 51 circuit court clerk's offices pursuant to § 17.1-276, or through designated application service providers. 52 Compliance with secure remote access standards developed by the Virginia Information Technologies 53 Agency pursuant to § 17.1-294 shall be certified by the individual circuit court clerks' offices to the Compensation Board. The individual circuit court clerk's office or its designated application service 54 55 provider shall certify compliance with such secure remote access standards. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the Compensation Board from allocating trust fund money to individual circuit court clerks' 56 57 offices for the purpose of complying with such secure remote access standards or redaction of social 58 security numbers from land records.

59 2. If a circuit court clerk proceeds to accelerate the redaction of social security numbers from land 60 records using local funds, the clerk may request reimbursement for such expenditures from the Technology Trust Fund in accordance with clause (iv) of subsection B to provide reimbursement to the 61 62 locality for advancing such funds in the fiscal year in which such local expenditures are incurred. For 63 local expenditures to accelerate the redaction of social security numbers from land records incurred in 64 prior fiscal years for which reimbursement has not been previously made, the Compensation Board may 65 approve payment to the locality in accordance with clause (iv) of subsection B upon certification by the 66 locality that it has advanced such funds.

3. Every circuit court clerk shall provide secure remote access to land records pursuant to § 17.1-294 67 **68** on or before July 1, 2008.

E. Such fee shall not be assessed to any instrument to be recorded in the deed books nor any 69 70 judgment to be docketed in the judgment lien docket books tendered by any federal, state or local 71 government.

72 F. If a circuit court clerk provides secure remote access to land records on or before July 1, 2008, 73 then that clerk may apply to the Compensation Board for an allocation from the Technology Trust Fund 74 for automation and technology improvements in his office that are not related to land records. Such 75 request shall not exceed the deposits into the trust fund credited to that locality. The Compensation Board in approval of such application shall consider what local funds have been spent by the 76 77 jurisdiction to accelerate the implementation of the technology plan approved by the Virginia 78 Information Technologies Agency in each circuit court clerk's office. Notwithstanding the foregoing, 79 before any application for funds is made to the Compensation Board for any request for automation or 80 technology improvements that would in any way modify, supplement or to any degree supplant any statewide case management system or financial management system, or any feature of any such system, 81 operated by the Office of the Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court of Virginia, such request shall 82 83 be approved by the Executive Secretary.

G. Information regarding the technology programs adopted by the circuit court clerks shall be shared 84 with the Virginia Information Technologies Agency, The Library of Virginia, and the Office of the 85 86 Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court.

87 H. Nothing in this section shall be construed to diminish the duty of local governing bodies to 88 furnish supplies and equipment to the clerks of the circuit courts pursuant to § 15.2-1656. Revenue 89 raised as a result of this section shall in no way supplant current funding to circuit court clerks' offices 90 by local governing bodies.

91 I. Effective July 1, 2006, except for transfers pursuant to this section, there shall be no transfers out 92 of the fund, including transfers to the general fund. 93

§ 17.1-293. Posting and availability of certain information on the Internet; prohibitions.
A. Notwithstanding Chapter 37 (§ 2.2-3700 et seq.) of Title 2.2 or subsection B of this section, it 94 95 shall be unlawful for any court clerk to disclose the social security number or other identification numbers appearing on driver's licenses or information on credit cards, debit cards, bank accounts, or 96 97 other electronic billing and payment systems that was supplied to a court clerk for the purpose of paying 98 fees, fines, taxes, or other charges collected by such court clerk. The prohibition shall not apply where 99 disclosure of such information is required (i) to conduct or complete the transaction for which such information was submitted or (ii) by other law or court order. 100

101 B. Beginning January 1, 2004, no court clerk shall post on the Internet any document that contains 102 the following information: (i) an actual signature, (ii) a social security number, (iii) a date of birth identified with a particular person, (iv) the maiden name of a person's parent so as to be identified with 103 a particular person, (v) any financial account number or numbers, or (vi) the name and age of any minor 104 105 child.

106 C. Each such clerk shall post notice that includes a list of the documents routinely posted on its 107 website.

108 D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit access to any original document as provided 109 by law. 110

E. This section shall not apply to the following:

111 1. Providing access to any document among the land records via secure remote access pursuant to 112 § 17.1-294: 113

2. Postings related to legitimate law-enforcement purposes;

114 3. Postings of historical, genealogical, interpretive, or educational documents and information about 115 historic persons and events; 116

4. Postings of instruments and records filed or recorded prior to 1907; and

117 5. Providing secure remote access to any person and his counsel to documents filed in matters to 118 which such person is a party.

119 F. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the Supreme Court or any other court from providing online 120 access to a case management system, in a manner consistent with the provisions of § 17.1-502, that may 121 include abstracts of case filings and proceedings in the courts of the Commonwealth.

122 G. The court clerk shall be immune from suit arising from any acts or omissions relating to 123 providing remote access on the Internet pursuant to this section unless the clerk was grossly negligent or 124 engaged in willful misconduct.

This subsection shall not be construed to limit, withdraw, or overturn any defense or immunity
 already existing in statutory or common law, or to affect any cause of action accruing prior to July 1,
 2005.

128 § 17.1-502. Administrator of circuit court system.

129 The Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court shall be the administrator of the circuit court system, 130 which shall include responsibility for the operation and maintenance of any statewide case management 131 system and financial management system, and related technology improvements, that the Executive 132 Secretary shall deem necessary for the administration of the circuit court system. Circuit courts shall 133 not withdraw from, modify or supplement any statewide case management system or financial management system without prior approval from the Executive Secretary. He shall assist the chief judges 134 135 in the performance of their administrative duties. He may employ such staff and other assistants, from 136 state funds appropriated to him for the purpose, as may be necessary to carry out his duties, and may 137 secure such office space as may be requisite, to be located in an appropriate place to be selected by the 138 Executive Secretary.
