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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 45.1-254 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the national pollutant 3 discharge elimination system permits for mining operations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6 7

1. That § 45.1-254 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 45.1-254. National pollutant discharge elimination system permits.

8 9 A. Upon request of the Director, the State Water Control Board may delegate to the Director its 10 authority, under the State Water Control Law, Chapter 3.1 (§ 62.1-44.2 et seq.) of Title 62.1 to issue, amend, revoke and enforce national pollutant discharge elimination system permits for the discharge of 11 sewage, industrial wastes and other wastes from coal surface mining operations. Upon receiving such 12 delegation, the authority to issue, amend, revoke and enforce national pollutant discharge elimination 13 system permits under the State Water Control Law for the discharge of sewage, industrial wastes and 14 15 other wastes from coal surface mining operations, to the extent required under the federal Clean Water Act, P.L. 92-500, as amended, shall be vested solely in the Director, notwithstanding any provision of 16 17 law contained in Title 62.1, except as provided herein. For the purpose of enforcement under this section, the provisions of §§ 62.1-44.31 and 62.1-44.32 shall apply to permits, orders and regulations 18 19 issued by the Director in accordance with this section.

20 B. After having received delegation of authority pursuant to subsection A of this section, the Director 21 shall transmit to the State Water Control Board a copy of each application for a national pollutant discharge elimination system permit received by the Director, and provide written notice to the State 22 23 Water Control Board of every action related to the consideration of such permit application.

24 C. Prior to the issuance or reissuance of a permit, applicants shall submit an application on a form 25 approved by the Director and a fee of \$300 for each discharge outfall point under the permit. If an 26 application is approved the permittee shall, on the anniversary of the permit approval for each year of 27 the permit term, submit \$300 for each discharge outfall point under the permit. Each permit shall 28 remain valid for five years. All fees provided for under this section shall be in addition to any other fees 29 levied pursuant to this chapter.

30 D. No national pollutant elimination system permit shall be issued if, within thirty days of the date 31 of the transmittal of the complete application and the proposed national pollution discharge elimination 32 system permit, the State Water Control Board objects in writing to the issuance of such permit. 33 Whenever the State Water Control Board objects to the issuance of such permit under this section, such 34 written objection shall contain a statement of the reasons for such objection and the effluent limitations 35 and conditions which such permits would include if it were issued by the State Water Control Board.

D E. An applicant who is aggrieved by an objection made under subsection C of this section shall 36 37 have the right to a hearing before the State Water Control Board pursuant to § 62.1-44.25. If the State 38 Water Control Board withdraws, in writing, its objection to the issuance of a certificate, the Director 39 may issue the permit. Any applicant, aggrieved by a final decision of the State Water Control Board 40 made pursuant to this subsection, shall have the right to judicial review in accordance with the 41 provisions of the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.).

42 E F. Whenever, on the basis of any information available to it, the State Water Control Board finds 43 that any person is in violation of any condition or limitation contained in a national pollutant discharge elimination system permit issued by the Director, it shall notify the person in alleged violation and the 44 Director. If beyond the thirtieth day after notification by the State Water Control Board, the Director has 45 not commenced appropriate enforcement action, the State Water Control Board may take appropriate enforcement action pursuant to §§ 62.1-44.15, 62.1-44.23 and 62.1-44.32. 46 47

F G. The Director shall promulgate such regulations as he deems necessary for the issuance, 48 administration, monitoring and enforcement of national pollutant discharge elimination system permits 49 50 for coal surface mining operations.

G H. For the purpose of this section, the terms "sewage," "industrial wastes" and "other wastes" shall 51 52 have the meanings ascribed to them in § 62.1-44.3.

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
