AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

(Proposed by the House Committee on Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources

on February 27, 2008)

(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Ticer)

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A BILL to amend and reenact § 10.1-1422.6 of the Code of Virginia, relating to used motor oil.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That § 10.1-1422.6 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

§ 10.1-1422.6. Used motor oil, oil filters, and antifreeze; signs; establishment of statewide program.

A. The Department shall establish a statewide *management program for* used motor oil, *other fluids for automotive engine maintenance, and* oil filters, and antifreeze management program. The program shall encourage the environmentally sound management of motor oil, *other fluids used for automotive engine maintenance, and* oil filters, and antifreeze by (i) educating consumers on the environmental benefits of proper management, (ii) publicizing options for proper disposal, and (iii) promoting a management infrastructure that allows for the convenient recycling of these materials by the public. The Department may contract with a qualified public or private entity to implement this program.

B. The Department shall maintain a statewide list of sites that accept used (i) motor oil, (ii) other *fluids used for automotive engine maintenance, and (iii)* oil filters, and (iii) antifreeze from the public.
The list shall be updated at least annually. The Department shall create, maintain, and promote an
Internet Web sitea toll-free hotline number and a website where consumers may receive information
describing the location of collection sites in their locality to properly dispose of used motor oil, oil
filters, and antifreeze.

C. The Department shall establish an ongoing outreach program to existing and potential collection
sites that provides a point of contact for questions and disseminates information on (i) the way to
establish a collection site, (ii) technical issues associated with being a collection site, and (iii) the
benefits of continued participation in the program.

D. Any person who sells motor oil, other fluids used for automotive engine maintenance, or oil 27 28 filters, or antifreeze at the retail level and who does not accept the return of used motor oil, other fluids 29 used for automotive engine maintenance, or oil filters, or antifreeze shall post a sign that encourages the 30 environmentally sound management of these products and provides a Web sitewebsite address and toll-free hotline number where additional information on the locations of used motor oil, other fluids 31 32 used for automotive engine maintenance, and oil filters and antifreeze collection sites are available. This 33 sign shall be provided by the Department or its designee to all establishments selling motor oil, other 34 fluids used for automotive engine maintenance, or oil filters, or antifreeze. In determining the size and 35 manner in which such signs may be affixed or displayed at the retail establishment, the Department shall 36 give consideration to the space available in such retail establishments.

E. Any person who violates any provision of subsection D shall be subject to a fine of twenty-five dollars \$25.
