That §§ 2.2-2001 and 2.2-4310 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: § 2.2-2001. Administrative responsibilities of the Department. 11 A. The Department shall be responsible for the establishment, operation, administration, and 12 maintenance of offices and programs related to services for veterans of the armed forces of the United 13 States and their Virginia-domiciled surviving spouses, orphans, and dependents. Such services shall 14 15 include, but not be limited to, benefits claims processing and all medical care centers and cemeteries for 16 veterans owned and operated by the Commonwealth. B. The Department shall adopt reasonable regulations to implement a program to certify, upon 17 request of the small business owner, that he holds a "service disabled veteran" status. 18 19 "Service disabled veteran" means a veteran who (i) served on active duty in the United States 20 military ground, naval, or air service, (ii) was discharged or released under conditions other than 21 dishonorable, and (iii) has a service-connected disability rating fixed by the United States Veterans 22 Administration of (a) 50% or greater or (b) 10% or greater if the service connected disability is combat 23 related Department of Veterans Affairs. 24 "Service disabled veteran business" means a business concern that is at least 51% owned by one or 25 more service disabled veterans or, in the case of a corporation, partnership, or limited liability company or other entity, at least 51% of the equity ownership interest in the corporation, partnership, or limited 26 27 liability company or other entity is owned by one or more individuals who are service disabled veterans 28 and both the management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more individuals who 29 are service disabled veterans. 30 § 2.2-4310. Discrimination prohibited; participation of small, women-, minority- and service disabled 31 veteran-owned business. 32 A. In the solicitation or awarding of contracts, no public body shall discriminate against a bidder or 33 offeror because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, status as a service disabled veteran, or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment. Whenever 34 35 solicitations are made, each public body shall include businesses selected from a list made available by 36 the Department of Minority Business Enterprise. 37 B. All public bodies shall establish programs consistent with this chapter to facilitate the participation 38 of small businesses and businesses owned by women, minorities, and service disabled veterans in procurement transactions. The programs established shall be in writing and shall comply with the 39 40 provisions of any enhancement or remedial measures authorized by the Governor pursuant to subsection 41 C or, where applicable, by the chief executive of a local governing body pursuant to § 15.2-965.1, and shall include specific plans to achieve any goals established therein. State agencies shall submit annual 42 progress reports on small, women- and minority-owned business procurement and on service disabled 43 veteran-owned business procurement to the Department of Minority Business Enterprise in a form 44 45 specified by the Department of Minority Business Enterprise. The Department of Minority Business 46 Enterprise shall make information on service disabled veteran-owned procurement available to the 47 Department of Veterans Services upon request. 48 C. Whenever there exists (i) a rational basis for small business enhancement or (ii) a persuasive 49 analysis that documents a statistically significant disparity between the availability and utilization of women- and minority-owned businesses, the Governor is authorized and encouraged to require state 50 51 agencies to implement appropriate enhancement or remedial measures consistent with prevailing law. 52 D. In the solicitation or awarding of contracts, no state agency, department or institution shall 53 discriminate against a bidder or offeror because the bidder or offeror employs ex-offenders unless the 54 state agency, department or institution has made a written determination that employing ex-offenders on 55 the specific contract is not in its best interest. E. As used in this section: 56 57 "Minority individual" means an individual who is a citizen of the United States or a non-citizen who

is in full compliance with United States immigration law and who satisfies one or more of the following

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**59** definitions:

60 1. "African American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Africa and61 who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part.

62 2. "Asian American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East,
63 Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands, including but not limited to Japan, China,
64 Vietnam, Samoa, Laos, Cambodia, Taiwan, Northern Mariana, the Philippines, a U.S. territory of the
65 Pacific, India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, or Sri Lanka and who is regarded as such by the community of
66 which this person claims to be a part.

67 3. "Hispanic American" means a person having origins in any of the Spanish-speaking peoples of
68 Mexico, South or Central America, or the Caribbean Islands or other Spanish or Portuguese cultures and
69 who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part.

4. "Native American" means a person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and who is regarded as such by the community of which this person claims to be a part or who is recognized by a tribal organization.

73 "Minority-owned business" means a business concern that is at least 51% owned by one or more 74 minority individuals or in the case of a corporation, partnership, or limited liability company or other 75 entity, at least 51% of the equity ownership interest in the corporation, partnership, or limited liability 76 company or other entity is owned by one or more minority individuals and both the management and 77 daily business operations are controlled by one or more minority individuals.

78 "Service disabled veteran" means a veteran who (i) served on active duty in the United States
79 military ground, naval, or air service, (ii) was discharged or released under conditions other than
80 dishonorable, and (iii) has a service-connected disability rating fixed by the United States Veterans
81 Administration of (a) 50% or greater or (b) 10% or greater if the service-connected disability is combat
82 related Department of Veterans Affairs.

83 "Service disabled veteran business" means a business concern that is at least 51% owned by one or

93 unit of state government. "State agency" shall not include any county, city, or town.
94 "Women-owned business" means a business concern that is at least 51% owned by one or more
