WHEREAS, committed to improving the quality of life in Fairfax County, Elaine McConnell has been a dedicated environmentalist who worked diligently to protect and preserve the sensitive Occoquan Watershed; and

WHEREAS, Elaine McConnell is an accomplished pianist, organist, and composer, who has contributed in many ways as a faithful member of the Messiah United Methodist Church in Springfield, and she has been a tireless supporter of the church's many missions in the community; and

WHEREAS, throughout her career, Elaine McConnell has supported public policies that are in the best interest of her fellow citizens, and she looks forward to continuing to serve her community in any way she can in the future; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly commend Elaine McConnell on her outstanding leadership and service to the citizens of Fairfax County; and, be it
