086209232 **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 77** 1 2 Senate Amendments in [] — February 5, 2008 3 Establishing a joint subcommittee to study strategies and models for substance abuse prevention and 4 treatment that effectively reduce the costly service demands created by substance abuse. Report. 5 6 7 Patron Prior to Engrossment-Senator Hanger 8 Referred to Committee on Rules 9 10 WHEREAS, a 2005 report released by the Bureau of Justice Statistics found that 68 percent of jail 11 inmates reported symptoms in the year before their admission to jail that met substance dependence or abuse criteria and 16 percent of convicted jail inmates said that they committed their offense to get 12 13 money for drugs; and 14 WHEREAS, studies have found that recovery treatment services offered to offenders are successful in 15 preventing recidivism; and WHEREAS, recidivism remains high for offenders exhibiting substance abuse or co-occurring 16 17 disorders who do not receive treatment services when diverted from jail; and WHEREAS, the California Drug and Alcohol Treatment Assessment found that a dollar invested in 18 19 alcohol and drug treatment resulted in over seven dollars in social savings due to reductions in crime 20 and health care costs; [ and 21 WHEREAS, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission is currently conducting a study 22 pursuant to House Joint Resolution 683 and Senate Joint Resolution 395 from the 2007 Session of the 23 General Assembly that is examining the impact of substance abuse on State and local expenditures and 24 potential investments in substance abuse services that could maximize savings to the Commonwealth; ] 25 now, therefore, be it 26 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That a joint subcommittee be 27 established to study strategies and models for substance abuse prevention and treatment that effectively 28 reduce the costly service demands created by substance abuse. The joint subcommittee shall have a total 29 membership of [14 11] members that shall consist of [eight five] legislative members, three 30 nonlegislative citizen members, and three ex officio members. Members shall be appointed as follows: [ three two ] members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; [ five three ] 31 32 members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of 33 34 Delegates; one nonlegislative citizen member representing a private or nonprofit organization dedicated 35 to substance abuse prevention or treatment programs to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; 36 and two nonlegislative citizen members representing a private or nonprofit organization dedicated to 37 substance abuse prevention or treatment programs to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of 38 Delegates. The Commissioner of Social Services, the Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health, 39 Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, and the Director of the Department of Corrections or 40 their designees shall serve ex officio with [voting nonvoting] privileges. Nonlegislative citizen 41 members of the joint subcommittee shall be residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia. Unless otherwise approved in writing by the chairman of the joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk, 42 nonlegislative citizen members shall only be reimbursed for travel originating and ending within the 43 Commonwealth of Virginia for the purpose of attending meetings. If a companion joint resolution of the 44 other chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required. The joint 45 subcommittee shall elect a chairman and vice- chairman from among its membership, who shall be 46 47 members of the General Assembly. In conducting its study, the joint subcommittee shall (i) identify and characterize the nature of **48** 49 substance abuse in the Commonwealth; (ii) identify current state policies and programs targeting substance abuse prevention and treatment; (iii) examine the cost of such policies and programs to the 50 51 Commonwealth; (iv) identify and examine policies and prevention programs from other leading states in the field of substance abuse and prevention; and (v) benchmark the Commonwealth's substance abuse 52 53 prevention and treatment programs and policies against those of the leading states. 54 Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the Senate. Legal, research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint subcommittee shall be provided by 55 the Division of Legislative Services. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the 56 57 joint subcommittee for this study, upon request. The joint subcommittee shall be limited to four meetings for the 2008 interim, and the direct costs of 58 59 this study shall not exceed  $\left[ \frac{9,200}{9,200} 6,200 \right]$  without approval as set out in this resolution. Approval for

unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require the written authorization of the chairman of the
joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is
agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required.

No recommendation of the joint subcommittee shall be adopted if a majority of the Senate members or a majority of the House members appointed to the joint subcommittee (i) vote against the recommendation and (ii) vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the joint subcommittee.

67 The joint subcommittee shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2008, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and 68 recommendations no later than the first day of the 2009 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The 69 executive summary shall state whether the joint subcommittee intends to submit to the General 70 71 Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or 72 Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports 73 and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. 74

75 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
76 Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or
77 delay the period for the conduct of the study, or authorize additional meetings during the 2008 interim.
