- 5. Summary: This bill changes references under the powers and duties of the Commissioner of Veterans Services from the Secretary of Administration to the Secretary of Public Safety. The bill also (i) adds the Chair of the Board of Trustees of the Veterans Services Foundation as a non voting member of the Joint Leadership Council of Veterans Service Organizations, (ii) adds the Chair of the Joint Leadership Council of Veterans Services Organizations as a voting member of the board of trustees of the Veterans Services Foundation, and (iii) establishes the Veterans Services Foundation as a body politic and corporate to provide funding for veteran services and programs in the Commonwealth.

- 7. Budget amendment necessary: No.
- **8. Fiscal implications:** The Veterans Services Foundation currently serves as an advisory foundation, raising funds, identifying existing revenue sources for veterans programs, and administering the Veterans Services Fund. The Joint Leadership Council of Veterans Services Organizations represents 23 veteran service organizations, such as the American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, and Veterans of Foreign Wars.

The bill adds a board member to the Veterans Services Foundation (the Chair of the Joint Leadership Council) and an additional representative to the Joint Leadership Council of Veterans Service Organizations (the Chair of the Veterans Services Foundation). The Foundation meets, on average, four times per year. With the addition of one board member, compensation and travel expense reimbursement for the Foundation will increase \$604. Adding the Chair of the Foundation to the Joint Leadership Council, which meets five times yearly on average, will increase reimbursements \$755. The total fiscal impact on the Department of Veterans Services will be \$1,359 annually, which the agency can absorb.
