## 4. Title: Payment for forest protection.

**5. Summary:** Payment for forest protection. Increases the annual amount a locality pays to the State Forester to provide forest fire protection, detection, prevention, and suppression from five cents to nine cents per acre over a period of two years.

- 7. Budget Amendment Necessary: Yes, to Item 103 to appropriate the additional revenue.
- 8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Forestry receives revenues from counties and certain municipalities for forest protection, forest fire detection, forest fire prevention and forest fire suppression. The counties and certain cities pay the agency, upon billing and proper documentation, an amount equal to five cents per acre for each acre protected. The last change to the cost occurred in 1988, or 20 years prior. Under the provisions of the bill, localities would pay an additional two cents in FY 2009 and an additional four cents beginning in FY 2010 and each year thereafter. The additional two cents in FY 2009 would generate an additional \$260,000 in revenue per year for the department; the additional four cents per acre would generate an additional \$520,000 in nongeneral fund revenue per year for the department.

The additional revenue will need to be appropriated in order for the agency to expend the funds; therefore, a budget amendment is necessary.
