4. Title: **Freezing access to credit reports**

5. Summary: The bill authorizes any consumer to freeze access to his credit report. If a consumer has placed a freeze on his credit report, a consumer reporting agency is prohibited from releasing the credit report, or any information in it, without the consumer's express authorization. The measure provides a means by which a consumer can release his report, permanently, temporarily, or to a specific third party. Certain disclosures are exempt from the freeze. A fee of up to \$10 may be charged for establishing or lifting a freeze, except identity theft victims are not required to pay a fee except for a temporary lifting of the freeze within 15 minutes of receipt of certain electronic requests. A person who willfully fails to comply with the requirements is liable to a consumer for actual damages of between \$100 and \$1,000, punitive damages, and reasonable attorney fees. A person who negligently fails to comply with the requirements is liable to a consumer for actual damages and reasonable attorney fees. The authority to bring an action for violation of subdivision E 1 b shall be with the Attorney General.

8. Fiscal Implications: The cost for the Attorney General's Office cannot be estimated, although it should be minimal. The bill limits the office's authority to bringing action for violation of the provision that a consumer protection agency shall lift the freeze within 15 minutes of a request through electronic contact method. The bill provides for the Attorney General's Office to recover any costs, reasonable expenses, and attorney's fees.

The fine revenue to the Literary fund may not be estimated.
