4. Title: Alien status of jail and correctional facility inmates.

5. Summary: Requires a jail officer to inquire of a person in his custody as to whether the person is a citizen of the United States and to communicate the results of the inquiry, including a result specifying that this information is unknown, to the Local Inmate Data System of the State Compensation Board. The State Compensation Board shall submit the data on any such person to the Central Criminal Records Exchange on a monthly basis. The director, sheriff or other officer in charge of the facility shall make an immigration query to the Law Enforcement Support Center of the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement. The bill requires the officer in charge of a local or state correctional facility to communicate the results of any immigration alien query that results in confirmation that the person is illegally present in the United States to the Central Criminal Records Exchange. The proposal includes several enactment clauses. The first mandates the State Compensation Board to maintain in the Local Inmate Data System, and the Department of Corrections to maintain in its offender management system, a specific data field for the entry of the response received from the Law Enforcement Support Center of the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement. The second enactment clause requires the Department of Corrections to confirm the validity of the social security numbers given by inmates and omit from its database those social security numbers determined to be fictitious.

- 8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of State Police, the proposed legislation would have a first year IT (information technology) cost of \$62,220 and a second year cost of approximately \$8,040. These costs result from designing, developing, piloting and fully implementing an interface between LIDS (Local Inmate Data System) and the Central Criminal Records Exchange (CCRE). The second year cost is for basic maintenance of the system.

The Senate Finance Committee provided in their proposed budget \$62,220 from the general fund the first year and \$8,020 from the general fund the second year to support this legislation.

According to the Compensation Board and the Department of Corrections, the proposed legislation is not expected to have a fiscal impact on them.
