Lease of development rights program

5. Summary: The bill tasks the Office of Farmland Preservation to create a lease of development rights program. Under such program, properties of 20 acres and larger and that are enrolled in use value taxation programs would be eligible to participate in a lease of development rights program. The property owner would agree to relinquish "by right" development for seven years in exchange for a contractually agreed upon lease amount. The program would be voluntary and would still allow current use value taxation programs to remain in place. The bill requires the Board of Agriculture and Consumer Services to develop regulations to address issues of lease termination and renewal and other issues necessary for the establishment of the lease of development rights programs.

Fiscal Implications:** According to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, the Office of Farmland Preservation will require one additional full-time position to address the increased scope of the office as proposed by the bill. The estimated expenditures and one additional position will allow for a second position in the office with a salary of \$55,000 and benefits. An additional \$15,000 is included for operating costs, such as travel, computer and cell phone service, and office supplies, associated with the position.

The expenditure estimate does not include funding for lease payments.
