**4. Title:**            **Voter registration; procedures for applications and receipts.**

**5. Summary:** This bill provides that the state form for the application to register to vote shall contain a receipt that will be given to the applicant by any person receiving the application. The receipt states the name of the office or person receiving the application, the date received, and a phone number that the applicant may call to verify that he is registered. The requirements pertaining to the receipt are inapplicable when the applicant mails his application directly to a general registrar or the State Board of Elections.

**7. Budget Amendment Necessary:** Yes, Item 89 HB/SB 30.

**8. Fiscal Implications:**

State Board of Elections would incur costs to reimburse 134 local general registrar offices, in addition to state agencies designated to distribute voter registration forms. The Department of Motor Vehicles would not be impacted by this bill, since it currently distributes receipts.

The above expenses are based on a total estimated distribution of one million voter registration forms during presidential (2008, 2012) and gubernatorial (2009) election years and a distribution of 500,000 during other years. The cost calculation is based on \$.035 per page, as estimated by the State Board of Elections.
