- 4. Title: Prisoners; Notification of Child Support Due
- **5. Summary:** This legislation would require the Department of Corrections (DOC) to cooperate with the Division of Child Support Enforcement (DCSE) to provide at regular intervals, but at least annually, a list of persons incarcerated. Upon receipt of such list, DCSE must identify those prisoners who are the subject of a court or administrative order requiring them to pay child support and the amount of each prisoner's obligation. The division must then inform DOC of the prisoners owing child support payments so that DOC can inform the prisoner upon his reentry the amount of his arrearage.

6. Minimal Fiscal Impact

7. Budget Amendment Necessary: No

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill would necessitate an enhancement in the systems capabilities of both DOC and DCSE to facilitate a data match or automated exchange of information. The projected cost for programming of the child support system is approximately \$80,000 (800 hours x \$100/hr). This one-time expenditure of would be split between general fund (\$27,200) and federal dollars (\$52,800) and can be absorbed with existing DCSE appropriation.

The Department of Corrections has counselors at its reception and classification centers that work with inmates when they enter/exit the state's prison system. Among other activities, these counselors provide the inmates with information regarding the procedures and processes that could affect them while they are incarcerated. This bill would allow the counselors to provide notice of any child support payments for which the inmate is liable.
