WHEREAS, Russell Y. Garth of Arlington, a lifelong educator and respected advocate for his fellow citizens with disabilities, died on May 15, 2008, from complications of ALS; and

8 WHEREAS, Russell "Rusty" Garth was born and grew up in Louisville, Kentucky, and received a
9 bachelor's degree from Vanderbilt University, a master's degree in English from Indiana University, and
10 completed doctoral work in higher education at Stanford University; and

11 WHEREAS, throughout his distinguished career as an educator, Russell Garth was committed to 12 excellence in education for Virginia's young people, especially in the reform and improvement of 13 postsecondary education; and

14 WHEREAS, from 1987 through 2008, Russell Garth served as the exemplary executive vice 15 president of the Council of Independent Colleges (CIC); and

WHEREAS, during his tenure, Russell Garth helped develop the CIC's annual Presidents Instituteinto the largest gathering of college and university presidents in the nation; and

18 WHEREAS, Russell Garth previously served as deputy director of the Fund for the Improvement of
 19 Postsecondary Education, which is administered by the United States Department of Education, and as a
 20 staff member to the California Postsecondary Education Commission; and

21 WHEREAS, Russell Garth made contributions to the study of developmental learning, such as his 22 insights as coeditor of the book *Learning in Groups*, which was published in 1983; and

WHEREAS, the father of a son born with disabilities, Russell Garth became a caring and dedicatedchampion for all people with intellectual and developmental disabilities; and

25 WHEREAS, Russell Garth received numerous accolades over the years, including distinguished
 26 service awards for his many contributions to his community from the Arc of Northern Virginia and the
 27 Arlington County Department of Human Services; and

WHEREAS, Russell Garth will be fondly remembered for his compassion for others and his kind
and generous nature and will be greatly missed by his devoted wife of 38 years, Judi; his daughter,
Erin, and son, Ryan; his brother, Dale Garth; and many friends and colleagues throughout the
