5 6	(Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Dance) A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 2.2-3309.1, 2.2-3310, and 22.1-17.4 of the Code of Virginia, relating
7	to certain honorary diplomas.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That §§ 2.2-3309.1, 2.2-3310, and 22.1-17.4 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted
10	as follows:
11	§ 2.2-3309.1. Virginia World War II Veterans Appreciation Week; Virginia Korean War Veterans
12 13	Appreciation Week; honorary diplomas to be awarded under certain circumstances during such weeks.
13 14	A. In recognition of the sacrifice of the members of the United States Armed Forces who served in World War II, the first full week in September, i.e., the week that was the first full official week of
15	peace in 1945, shall hereby be designated the Virginia World War II Veterans Appreciation Week,
16	beginning in September 2001.
17	In accordance with the Board of Education's guidelines as authorized by § 22.1-17.4, any veteran of
18	World War II may apply for a Commonwealth of Virginia World War II Veteran Honorary High School
19	Diploma by filing with the Virginia Board of Education a statement declaring that:
20 21	1. During the years between 1939 and 1945, he served in any branch of the United States Armed Forces <i>and was subsequently honorably discharged</i> ;

23	school student in any school in any state or territory of the United States or any school located on or
24	associated with a United States military base or embassy; and
25	3. He was unable to resume his secondary education upon returning to civilian life.
26 27	B. In recognition of the sacrifice of the members of the United States Armed Forces who served

29	In accordance with the Board of Education's guidelines as authorized by § 22.1-17.4, any veteran of
30	the Korean War may apply for a Commonwealth of Virginia Korean War Veteran Honorary High
31	School Diploma by filing with the Virginia Board of Education a statement declaring that:
32	1. During the years between 1950 and 1953, he served in any branch of the United States Armed
33 34	Forces <i>and was subsequently honorably discharged</i> ; 2. He enlisted in or was drafted into the United States Armed Forces while still enrolled as a
35	secondary school student in any school in any state or territory of the United States or any school
36	located on or associated with a United States military base or embassy; and
37	3. He was unable to resume his secondary education upon returning to civilian life.
38	C. Upon receiving a statement in compliance with this section and § 22.1-17.4 that has been filed in
39	accordance with its guidelines, the Board of Education shall award the veteran described in subsections
40 41	A or B, a Commonwealth of Virginia World War II Veteran Honorary High School Diploma or a Commonwealth of Virginia Korean War Veteran Honorary High School Diploma, as appropriate. Such
42	diploma shall also be delivered during Virginia World War II Veterans Appreciation Week or Virginia
43	Korean War Veterans Appreciation Week, as appropriate.
44	§ 2.2-3310. Vietnam War Memorial Dedication and Veterans' Recognition Week.
45	A. The first full week of November of each year shall be designated as Vietnam War Memorial
46 47	Dedication Week and Veterans' Recognition Week in the Commonwealth, to honor in perpetuity the men and women who have served their country as members of the armed forces during the Vietnam
48	ConflictWar.
49	B. In accordance with the Board of Education's guidelines as authorized by § 22.1-17.4, any veteran
50	of the Vietnam War may apply for a Commonwealth of Virginia Vietnam War Veteran Honorary High
51	School Diploma by filing with the Virginia Board of Education a statement declaring that:
52 52	1. During the years between 1959 and 1975, he served in any branch of the United States Armed
53 54	Forces and was subsequently honorably discharged; 2. He enlisted in or was drafted into the United States Armed Forces while still enrolled as a

64 A. Any veteran of World War II may apply to the Board of Education for a Commonwealth of Virginia World War II Veteran Honorary High School Diploma by filing, in compliance with Board 65 66 guidelines, a statement declaring that:

1. During the years between 1939 and 1945, he served in any branch of the United States Armed 67 Forces and was subsequently honorably discharged; 68

2. He was drafted or did enlist in the United States Armed Forces while still enrolled as a secondary 69 school student in any school in any state or territory of the United States or any school located on or 70 71 associated with a United States military base or embassy; and 72

3. He was unable to resume his secondary education upon returning to civilian life.

B. Any veteran of the Korean War may apply to the Board of Education for a Commonwealth of 73 Virginia Korean War Veteran Honorary High School Diploma by filing, in compliance with Board 74 75 guidelines, a statement declaring that:

1. During the years between 1950 and 1953, he served in any branch of the United States Armed 76 77 Forces and was subsequently honorably discharged;

78 2. He enlisted in or was drafted into the United States Armed Forces while still enrolled as a 79 secondary school student in any school in any state or territory of the United States or any school located on or associated with a United States military base or embassy; and 80 81

3. He was unable to resume his secondary education upon returning to civilian life.

C. Any veteran of the Vietnam War may apply to the Board of Education for a Commonwealth of 82 Virginia Vietnam War Veteran Honorary High School Diploma by filing, in compliance with Board 83 84 guidelines, a statement declaring that:

85 1. During the years between 1959 and 1975, he served in any branch of the United States Armed 86 Forces and was subsequently honorably discharged;

87 2. He enlisted in or was drafted into the United States Armed Forces while still enrolled as a 88 secondary school student in any school in any state or territory of the United States or any school 89 located on or associated with a United States military base or embassy; and 90

3. He was unable to resume his secondary education upon returning to civilian life.

91 CD. The Board of Education shall establish guidelines setting forth the timelines and procedures for 92 applying for such diplomas. Upon the filing of the required statement in accordance with its guidelines, 93 the Board of Education shall award the veteran either a Commonwealth of Virginia World War II Veteran Honorary High School Diploma, or a Commonwealth of Virginia Korean War Veteran 94 Honorary High School Diploma, or a Commonwealth of Virginia Vietnam War Veteran Honorary High School Diploma. Such diplomas shall be delivered to eligible veterans during the first full week in September that has been designated, in accordance with § 2.2-3309.1, as the Virginia World War II Veterans Appreciation Week, or during the first full week in November that has been designated, in 95 96 97 98 99 accordance with § 2.2-3309.1, as the Virginia Korean War Veterans Appreciation Week, or during the first full week in November that has been designated, in accordance with § 2.2-3310, as Vietnam War 100 Memorial Dedication Week and Veterans' Recognition Week in the Commonwealth. 101
