Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, it shall be unlawful for any state agency 15 employer, as a condition of employment or during the course of employment, to ask a prospective employee or an employee any question concerning the individual's record of any arrest or conviction of 16 a violation of any criminal law of the Commonwealth or of any other state or the United States, unless 17 18 the question refers to an arrest or conviction that: 19 1. Occurred within eight years preceding the employer's questioning; or 20 2. Was for an offense punishable as a violent felony as defined in § 17.1-805 or 19.2-297.1. 21

B. No employee of a state agency shall be discharged, demoted, or otherwise discriminated against, and no prospective employee of a state agency shall be denied employment, by the employer solely on the basis of the individual's response or failure to respond to a question that the employer is prohibited from asking pursuant to subsection A.

C. A violation of this section is punishable by a civil penalty not to exceed \$500.

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
