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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 2.2-2010 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the powers of the Virginia 3 Information Technologies Agency.

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Approved

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6 7

1. That § 2.2-2010 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 2.2-2010. Additional powers of VITA.

9 VITA shall have the following additional powers which, with the approval of the CIO, may be 10 exercised by a division of VITA with respect to matters assigned to that division:

1. Prescribe regulations necessary or incidental to the performance of duties or execution of powers 11 12 conferred under this chapter.

13 2. Plan and forecast future needs for information technology and conduct studies and surveys of 14 organizational structures and best management practices of information technology systems and 15 procedures.

16 3. Assist state agencies and public institutions of higher education in the development of information 17 management plans and the preparation of budget requests for information technology that are consistent with the policies and procedures developed pursuant to § 2.2-2007. 18

19 4. Develop and adopt policies, standards, and guidelines for managing information technology by 20 state agencies and institutions.

21 5. Develop and adopt policies, standards, and guidelines for the procurement of information 22 technology and telecommunications goods and services of every description for state agencies.

23 6. Direct the establishment of statewide standards for the efficient exchange of electronic information 24 and technology, including infrastructure, between the public and private sectors in the Commonwealth.

25 7. Direct the compilation and maintenance of an inventory of information technology, including, but 26 not limited to, personnel, facilities, equipment, goods, and contracts for services.

27 8. Develop statewide technical and data standards for information technology and related systems to 28 promote efficiency and uniformity.

29 9. Evaluate the needs of agencies in the Commonwealth with regard to (i) a consistent, reliable, and 30 secure information technology infrastructure, (ii) existing capabilities with regard to building and 31 supporting that infrastructure, and (iii) recommended approaches to ensure the future development, 32 maintenance, and financing of an information technology infrastructure befitting the needs of state 33 agencies and the service level requirements of its citizens.

34 10. Establish fee schedules that shall be collectible from users when general fund appropriations are 35 not applicable to the services rendered.

11. Provide for the centralized marketing, provision, leasing, and executing of license agreements for 36 37 electronic access to public information and government services through the Internet, wireless devices, 38 personal digital assistants, kiosks, or other such related media on terms and conditions as may be 39 determined to be in the best interest of the Commonwealth. VITA may fix and collect fees and charges 40 for (i) public information, media, and other incidental services furnished by it to any private individual 41 or entity, notwithstanding the charges set forth in § 2.2-3704 and (ii) such use and services it provides to 42 any state agency or local government. Nothing in this subdivision authorizing VITA to fix and collect 43 fees for providing information services shall be construed to prevent access to the public records of any public body pursuant to the provisions of the Virginia Freedom of Information Act (§ 2.2-3700 et seq.). 44 VITA is authorized, subject to approval by the Secretary of Technology, and any other affected 45 Secretariat, to delegate the powers and responsibilities granted in this subdivision to any agency within 46 the executive branch. 47

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
