10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That § 23-9.6:1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 23-9.6:1. Duties of Council generally.
13 14	In addition to such other duties as may be prescribed elsewhere, the State Council of Higher Education shall:
15	1. Develop a statewide strategic plan that reflects the goals set forth in subsection B of § 23-38.88
16 17	for higher education in the Commonwealth, identifies a coordinated approach to such state and regional goals, and emphasizes the future needs for higher education in Virginia at both the undergraduate and
18 19	the graduate levels, as well as the mission, programs, facilities and location of each of the existing institutions of higher education, each public institution's six-year plan, and such other matters as the
20	Council deems appropriate. The Council shall revise such plans at least once every six years and shall
21 22	submit such recommendations as are necessary for the implementation of the plan to the Governor and the General Assembly.
23 24	2. Review and approve or disapprove any proposed change in the statement of mission of any presently existing public institution of higher education and to define the mission of all public
25 26	institutions of higher education created after the effective date of this provision. The Council shall, within the time prescribed in subdivision 1, make a report to the Governor and the General Assembly
27	with respect to its actions hereunder. No such actions shall become effective until 30 days after
28 29	adjournment of the session of the General Assembly next following the filing of such a report. Nothing contained in this provision shall be construed to authorize the Council to modify any mission statement
30 31	adopted by the General Assembly, nor to empower the Council to affect, either directly or indirectly, the
32	selection of faculty or the standards and criteria for admission of any public institution, whether related to academic standards, residence or other criteria; it being the intention of this section that faculty
33 34	selection and student admission policies shall remain a function of the individual institutions. 3. Study any proposed escalation of any public institution to a degree-granting level higher than that
35 36	level to which it is presently restricted and to submit a report and recommendation to the Governor and the General Assembly relating to the proposal. The study shall include the need for and benefits or
37	detriments to be derived from the escalation. No such institution shall implement any such proposed
38 39	escalation until the Council's report and recommendation have been submitted to the General Assembly and the General Assembly approves the institution's proposal.
40 41	4. Review and approve or disapprove all enrollment projections proposed by each public institution of higher education. The Council's projections shall be in numerical terms by level of enrollment and
42	shall be used for budgetary and fiscal planning purposes only. The Council shall develop estimates of
43 44	the number of degrees to be awarded by each institution and include those estimates in its reports of enrollment projections. The student admissions policies for the institutions and their specific programs
45 46	shall remain the sole responsibility of the individual boards of visitors; however, all four-year institutions shall adopt dual admissions policies with the community colleges, as required by
47	§ 23-9.2:3.02.
48 49	5. Review and approve or disapprove all new academic programs which any public institution of higher education proposes. As used herein, "academic programs" include both undergraduate and
50 51	6. Review and require the discontinuance of any undergraduate or graduate academic program that is
52 53	presently offered by any public institution of higher education when the Council determines that such academic program is (i) nonproductive in terms of the number of degrees granted, the number of
54	students served by the program, the program's effectiveness, and budgetary considerations, or (ii)
55 56	supported by state funds and is unnecessarily duplicative of academic programs offered at other public institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth. The Council shall make a report to the Governor
57 58	and the General Assembly with respect to the discontinuance of any such academic program. No such discontinuance shall become effective until 30 days after the adjournment of the session of the General

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59 Assembly next following the filing of such report.

60 7. Review and approve or disapprove the creation and establishment of any department, school, college, branch, division or extension of any public institution of higher education that such institution 61 62 proposes to create and establish. This duty and responsibility shall be applicable to the proposed creation 63 and establishment of departments, schools, colleges, branches, divisions and extensions, whether located 64 on or off the main campus of the institution in question. If any organizational change is determined by 65 the Council to be proposed solely for the purpose of internal management and the institution's curricular offerings remain constant, the Council shall approve the proposed change. Nothing in this provision shall 66 be construed to authorize the Council to disapprove the creation and establishment of any department, 67 school, college, branch, division or extension of any institution that has been created and established by 68 69 the General Assembly.

8. Review the proposed closure of any academic program in a high demand or critical shortage area,
as defined by the Council, by any public institution of higher education and assist in the development of
an orderly closure plan, when needed.

9. Develop a uniform, comprehensive data information system designed to gather all information necessary to the performance of the Council's duties. The system shall include information on admissions, enrollments, self-identified students with documented disabilities, personnel, programs, financing, space inventory, facilities and such other areas as the Council deems appropriate.

10. Develop in cooperation with institutions of higher education guidelines for the assessment of
student achievement. An institution shall use an approved program that complies with the guidelines of
the Council and is consistent with the institution's mission and educational objectives in the development
of such assessment. The Council shall report the institutions' assessments of student achievement in the
biennial revisions to the state's master plan for higher education.

82 11. Develop in cooperation with the appropriate state financial and accounting officials and to
 83 establish uniform standards and systems of accounting, record keeping and statistical reporting for the
 84 public institutions of higher education.

85 12. Review biennially and approve or disapprove all changes in the inventory of educational and general space that any public institution of higher education may propose, and to make a report to the Governor and the General Assembly with respect thereto. No such change shall be made until 30 days after the adjournment of the session of the General Assembly next following the filing of such report.

89 13. Visit and study the operations of each of the public institutions of higher education at such times90 as the Council shall deem appropriate and to conduct such other studies in the field of higher education91 as the Council deems appropriate or as may be requested by the Governor or the General Assembly.

92 14. Provide advisory services to private, accredited and nonprofit institutions of higher education,
93 whose primary purpose is to provide collegiate or graduate education and not to provide religious
94 training or theological education, on academic, administrative, financial and space utilization matters.
95 The Council may also review and advise on joint activities, including contracts for services between
96 such public and private institutions of higher education or between such private institutions and any
97 agency of the Commonwealth or political subdivision thereof.

98 15. Adopt such rules and regulations as the Council believes necessary to implement all of the
99 Council's duties and responsibilities as set forth in this Code. The various public institutions of higher
100 education shall comply with such rules and regulations.

101 16. Issue guidelines consistent with the provisions of the federal Family Education Rights and
 102 Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 U.S.C. § 1232g requiring public institutions of higher education to release a
 103 student's academic and disciplinary record to a student's parent.

104 17. Develop and revise, as it deems necessary, in consultation with the Coordinator of Emergency
 105 Management, a model institutional crisis and emergency management plan for the purpose of assisting
 106 public and private two-year and four-year institutions of higher education in establishing, operating, and
 107 maintaining emergency services and disaster preparedness activities.

108 18. Require that each institution of higher education formed, chartered, or established in the 109 Commonwealth after July 1, 1980, shall ensure the preservation of student transcripts in the event of 110 institutional closure or revocation of approval to operate in the Commonwealth of Virginia. An 111 institution may provide for the preservation of student transcripts by binding agreement with another institution of higher education with which it is not corporately connected or in such other way as the 112 113 Council may authorize by regulation. In the event an institution closes, or has its approval to operate in the Commonwealth revoked, the Council, through its Director, may take such action as is necessary to 114 115 secure and preserve the student transcripts until such time as an appropriate institution accepts all or 116 some of the transcripts. Nothing in this section shall be deemed to interfere with the right of a student 117 to his own transcripts; nor shall this section authorize disclosure of student records except as may 118 otherwise be authorized by law.

119 19. Develop, in cooperation with the institutions of higher education, the Board of Nursing, and the120 Advisory Council on the Future of Nursing in Virginia, a strategic statewide plan to ensure an adequate

supply of nurses. The Council shall recommend to the Governor and the General Assembly such changes in public policy as may be necessary to meet the state's current and future need for essential nursing services.

124 20. Require the development and submission of articulation, transfer, and dual enrollment and 125 admissions agreements between two- and four-year public institutions of higher education in Virginia, 126 including programs for qualified students to be simultaneously accepted by a community college and a 127 four-year public institution of higher education and, upon successful completion of an associate degree 128 program from the community college, to be automatically enrolled in the four-year institution of higher 129 education. Dual admissions agreements shall set forth (i) the obligations of the students accepted in such 130 programs, including grade point average requirements, acceptable associate degree majors, and 131 completion timetables; and (ii) the student's access to the privileges of enrollment in both institutions 132 during the time enrolled in either institution. Such agreements shall be subject to the admissions 133 requirements of the four-year institutions, except as provided in § 23-9.2:3.02.

134 21. Provide periodic updates of base adequacy funding guidelines adopted by the Joint Subcommittee
 135 Studying Higher Education Funding Policies for the various public institutions.

136 22. Establish a task force in cooperation with the Virginia Community College Workforce
137 Development Office, the Department of Education's Office of Career and Technical Education, and
138 schools of education at public four-year institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth to
139 develop, and revise as necessary, a plan to expand teacher preparation programs for career and
140 technical education and other areas identified as critical shortage areas by the Board of Education.

In carrying out its duties and responsibilities, the Council, insofar as practicable, shall preserve the
 individuality, traditions and sense of responsibility of the respective institutions. The Council, insofar as
 practicable, shall seek the assistance and advice of the respective institutions in fulfilling all of its duties
 and responsibilities.
