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094454812 **HOUSE BILL NO. 2240** 1 2 House Amendments in [] - February 9, 2009 3 A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 2.2-2235 and 2.2-2238 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Virginia 4 Economic Development Partnership Authority; board of directors; powers. 5 Patron Prior to Engrossment-Delegate Valentine 6 7 Referred to Committee on General Laws 8 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That §§ 2.2-2235 and 2.2-2238 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 2.2-2235. Board of directors; members and officers; Executive Director. 11 The Authority shall be governed by a board of directors consisting of the Secretary of Commerce 12 13 and Trade, the Secretary of Finance, and the Chancellor of the Virginia Community College System, all or their designees, serving as ex officio, voting members, and 18 members to be appointed as follows: 14 15 (i) one from each congressional district in the Commonwealth and one citizen at large, appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by the General Assembly; (ii) four citizens at large appointed by the 16 Speaker of the House; and (iii) two citizens at large appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules. The 17 six citizens appointed by the General Assembly shall reside in regions of the Commonwealth that have a 18 19 higher unemployment rate than that of the statewide average unemployment rate as reported by the 20 Virginia Employment Commission for the preceding four years from the date of appointment. Ex officio members of the Board shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office. Four of the 12 directors 21 initially appointed by the Governor shall be appointed for terms of two and one-half years, three for 22 23 terms of four and one-half years, and five for terms of six and one-half years, from the effective date of 24 their appointment; and thereafter the terms of members of the Board shall be six years. No member 25 shall be eligible to serve more than two terms; however, after the expiration of the term of a member 26 appointed to serve three years or less, two additional terms may be served if appointed thereto. Any 27 appointment to fill a vacancy shall be for the unexpired term. A person appointed to fill a vacancy may 28 be appointed to serve two additional terms. Members of the Board shall receive their expenses and shall 29 be compensated at the rate provided in § 2.2-2104 for each day spent on the business of the Board. 30 The Board shall elect from its membership a chairman and a vice-chairman, and shall also elect a 31 secretary and a treasurer, who need not be members of the Board, and may also elect other subordinate officers, who need not be members of the Board. The Board may also form committees and advisory 32 33 councils, which may include representatives who are not members of the Board, to undertake more 34 extensive study and discussion of the issues before the Board. 35 A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of the Authority's business, and 36 no vacancy in the membership shall impair the right of a quorum to exercise the rights and perform all 37 duties of the Authority. 38 The Board shall appoint the chief executive officer of the Authority, who shall not be a member of 39 the Board, who shall be known as the Executive Director and who shall serve at the pleasure of the 40 Board and carry out such of the powers and duties conferred upon him by the Board. 41 § 2.2-2238. Economic development services. 42 A. It shall be the duty of the Authority to encourage, stimulate, and support the development and 43 expansion of the economy of the Commonwealth. The Authority is charged with the following duties 44 and responsibilities to: 45 1. See that there are prepared and carried out effective economic development marketing and 46 promotional programs; 2. Make available, in conjunction and cooperation with localities, chambers of commerce, industrial 47 authorities, and other public and private groups, to prospective new businesses basic information and 48 49 pertinent factors of interest and concern to such businesses; 50 3. Formulate, promulgate, and advance programs throughout the Commonwealth for encouraging the 51 location of new businesses in the Commonwealth and the retention and growth of existing businesses; 52 4. Encourage and solicit private sector involvement, support, and funding for economic development 53 in the Commonwealth: 54 5. Encourage the coordination of the economic development efforts of public institutions, regions, 55 communities, and private industry and collect and maintain data on the development and utilization of economic development capabilities; 56 6. Establish such offices within and without the Commonwealth that are necessary to the expansion 57 58 and development of industries and trade;

59 7. Encourage the export of products and services from the Commonwealth to international markets;60 and

8. Advise, upon request, the State Board for Community Colleges in designating technical training
programs in Virginia's comprehensive community colleges for the Community College Incentive
Scholarship Program pursuant to § 23-220.4.

64 9. Offer a program for the issuance of export documentation for companies located in Virginia
65 exporting goods and services if no federal agency or other regulatory body or issuing entity will provide
66 export documentation in a form deemed necessary [ by such companies for international commerce ].

67 B. The Authority shall prepare a specific plan annually that shall serve as the basis for marketing68 high unemployment areas of Virginia. This plan shall be submitted to the Governor and General69 Assembly annually on or before November 1 of each year. The report shall contain the plan and

Assembly annually on or before November 1 of each year. The report shall contain the plan and activities conducted by the Authority to market these high unemployment areas. The annual report shall be part of the report required by § 2.2-2242.
